

IAQ – New Hensel Phelps Construction Company Florida Headquarters

GLE was selected to perform air quality testing for Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design (LEED) for Commercial Interior Interiors 2.0 (Environmental Quality Credit 3.2) for the new 21,000 square foot Hensel Phelps Construction Company's Florida headquarters in Orlando. The testing was performed to determine if the indoor air quality levels for Formaldehyde, Particulates, Total Volatile Organic Compounds and Carbon Monoxide were within the published LEED standards. The intent of the EQ 3.2 standard is to prevent indoor air quality problems resulting from the construction/renovation process, in order to help sustain the comfort and the well being of construction workers and building occupants.
